Scope and Content

The U.S. Embassy Kuwait Collection consists of a letter of congratulations and appreciation from 104 Kuwaiti children to President Bush.

Biographical Note

U.S. Ambassador to Kuwait, Lawrence Silverman, donated this letter on behalf of the U.W. Embassy in Kuwait. This letter was signed by 104 Kuwaiti children shortly after the U.S.-led military coalition launched Operation Desert Storm and liberated Kuwait following the Iraqi invasion in February 1991. The original document includes flag stickers from coalition countries and a facsimile of the letter now hangs in the lobby of the U.S. Embassy in Kuwait.
