Provenance

Official records of George Bush's presidency are housed at the George Bush Presidential Library and administered by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) under the provisions of the Presidential Records Act (PRA).

Processed By

Staff Archivists, December 1999. Previously restricted materials are added as they are released.

Scope and Content

The materials in FOIA 1999-0472-F are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials.

FOIA 1999-0472-F contains materials related to the 1992 Drug Summit held in San Antonio, Texas. The summit, officially styled the Second Andean Drug Summit, was held February 26 and 27 in San Antonio. Hosted by President Bush, the summit was attended by official delegations from Peru, Colombia, Venezuela, Bolivia, Ecuador, and Mexico. Meetings were held at the McNay Art Museum, and the

President and Mrs. Bush hosted a state dinner at the Majestic Theatre on the night of February 26. The summit focused on ways in which to continue the "war on drugs" including domestic education programs as well as drug production eradication efforts within the Andean nations. President Bush also held bilateral talks with the leaders of the nations in attendance.

System of Arrangement

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in three collection areas—Bush Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files and Bush Presidential Records: Staff and Office Files. As policy, WHORM Subject Files are processed at the document level. Staff and Office Files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.

The WHORM Subject File compiled by the White House Office of Records Management is comprised of a series of documents assigned a letter/number combination and filed in a subject category. A complete listing of the subject categories including a detailed description of each category is available in our research room and on our website at <http://bushlibrary.tamu.edu/research/find/whorm/whorm.html>.

Please note that a single asterisk "*" indicates that the category is entirely processed and open.
