Access

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Bush Presidential Records is governed by the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)(5 USC 552 as amended) and the Presidential Records Act (PRA)(44 USC 22) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.

Copyright

Documents in this collection that were prepared by officials of the United States government as part of their official duties are in the public domain. Researchers are advised to consult the copyright law of the United States (Title 17, USC) which governs the making of photocopies or other reproductions of copyrighted material.

Provenance

Official records of George Bush's presidency are housed at the George Bush Presidential Library and administered by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) under the provisions of the Presidential Records Act (PRA).

Processed By

Staff Archivists, December 2007. Previously restricted materials are added as they are released.

Scope and Content

The materials in FOIA 2008-0066-F are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials.

FOIA 2008-0066-F consists of one file from the White House Counsels Office Staffing and Structure File and contains memoranda, questionnaires, a biographical sketch, and an informational paper. The memoranda establishes Robert Peter George as a potential appointee and as a qualified candidate to become a member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights and also makes the recommendation to pursue a full field background investigation in order to initiate final approval of Mr. George's appointment to the

commission. The questionnaires are routine in nature, provided to Robert George, for the purpose of establishing preliminary qualifications for serving as a member on the Commission on Civil Rights. The biographical sketches provided to the White House by Mr. George enclose his educational background, work experience, other board memberships, and publications. The informational paper provides institutional information and qualification requirements for the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. Robert P. George was successfully appointed to the commission.

System of Arrangement

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in one collection area—Bush Presidential Records: Staff and Office Files. As policy, Staff and Office Files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.
