#### **Scope and Content**

The materials in 2012-0071-S are a systematically processed body of documents from the White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject File category CO165. These records consist of government forms, letters, news releases, reports, published material, speeches, and publications on a variety of issues including the abolition of warfare against Russia, Jewish refuseniks, World War II war crimes, Baltic states' independence, Soviet entry and exit visas assistance, Soviet domination of Eastern European countries, nuclear disarmament, religious freedoms, opposition to perestroika, the Jackson-Vanik Amendment, food supplies in the Iron Curtain countries, environmental concerns, and suggestions

for summit discussions. Other topics include Moscow Embassy construction problems, humanitarian outreach missions, most favored nation status for the Soviet Union, multilateral financial assistance package for Russia and the other states of the former Soviet Union, cultural and religious rights, and agricultural trade issues.

### **System of Arrangement**

Records that are responsive to this request were found in Bush Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files.

The WHORM Subject File compiled by the White House Office of Records Management is comprised of a series of documents assigned a letter/number combination and filed in a subject category.
