Biographical Note

The Office of Policy and Development staff advised and assisted President Bush in the formulation, evaluation, and coordination of long-range domestic and economic policy. It supported the operations of Economic Policy Council (EPC). Warren Maruyama served as Deputy Associate Director, International Economic Policy from November 1989 until October 1992 when he was named Associate Director, International Economic Policy. He helped develop President George H.W. Bush's Super 301, NAFTA, Uruguay Round, and Steel Trade Liberalization initiatives. Maruyama served as an associate general counsel for the United States Trade Representative from 1983–1989, where he successfully litigated General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and U.S.-Canada Free Trade Agreement (FTA) disputes.

Scope and Content

The materials in Case Number 2023-0525-S are a systematically processed body of documents responsive to the topic. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials.

The Staff and Office Files contain correspondence, a statement, documents, talking points, lists, charts, and press releases. The memos and letters include topics such as reminders of strategy group meetings, biological diversity, Western financial assistance for the Soviet Union, trade action plans for Eastern Europe, a U.S.-Soviet trade agreement, waivers and adjustments, the Super 301 measure, the Uruquay Round multilateral trade negotiations, Canadian trade issues, Latin American concerns, and Asian considerations. Of particular note is a letter from Mikhail Gorbachev to President Bush regarding the Summit of Industrialized Countries help in Paris. U.S. Trade Representative Carla Hills' statement to United Nations representatives on a United States Biodiversity Convention Proposal is in this collection. Documents include drafts of free trade agreement negotiations with Mexico (labor standards, health, safety concerns, worker rights, and environmental matters), UNGA drafts of the Climate Change Convention, a scope paper on the UN Convention on Biological Diversity in Nairobi, a grain supply agreement between the U.S. and the U.S.S.R., U.S. commercial space launch policy documentation, an impact analysis on trade when Most Favored Nation status is granted to foreign countries, etc. Also included are White House-generated documents lining out informed perspectives of trade negotiation topics such as the environment, duty rebates and waivers, agreement adjustments, workplace standards, unfair trade practices, intellectual property, and U.S.-U.S.S.R. maritime agreements. Talking points crafted for United States delegates for the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED), also known as the Rio Conference or the Earth Summit, and the Soviet Union's economic situation are present. The lists contain issue papers topics and drafters, biodiversity intra-agency working group members and contact information. The charts illustrate global guotas of manufactured goods as well as other trade commodities both domestic and foreign. Lastly, press releases present coverage of the Earth Summit, a biodiversity treaty, the Soviet economic situation, a U.S.-Soviet joint plan for Soviet economy, a steel trade program, etc.
