#### **System of Arrangement**

Records for this systematic project were found in the following collection area—Bush Presidential Records: Staff and Office Files. Staff and Office Files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.

## Scope and Content

The materials in Case Number 2023-0832-S are a systematically processed body of documents responsive to the topic. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials.

The White House Office of Special Activities and Initiatives was primarily responsible for planning and staging the president's public appearances. The office was first directed by Stephen M. Studdert who was appointed on February 1, 1989. His title was Assistant to the President for Special Activities and Initiatives. He left his post in October of 1989. Prior to this service, Studdert directed George H. W. Bush's 1989 Presidential inauguration.

Case Number 2023-0862 contains mainly correspondence, video scripts, schedules, diagrams, calendars, papers, speeches, lists, press releases, newspaper and magazine articles, and White House forms. These records discuss various topics related to President Bush's trips. His domestic trips included destinations such as Washington D.C., Maine, New Hampshire, New York, Pennsylvania, Alaska, and Texas. His foreign trips included destinations such as Canada, Japan, China, and Korea. Some of the topics of these trips were swearing-in ceremonies for administration officials, conventions, ethnic and religious meetings, commemoration and recognition ceremonies, meetings with foreign dignitaries, and speeches he made overseas.
