PARTICIPANTS: The President Former Salvadoran President Duarte Notetaker: William T. Pryce

DATE, TIME September 27, 1989, 12:35-12:40 p.m. EDT AND PLACE: The Oval Office

The President telephoned former Salvadoran President Jose Napolean Duarte on September 27 to express concern for Duarte's health and convey his admiration for Duarte. (U)

<u>The President</u>: I've heard about your health problems and wanted to inquire about how you are and to send you our family love as you fight the problem. (U)

<u>President Duarte</u>: Thank you. I am under tension, I have a temperature, I have pneumonia. Things are not so good. $(\not e)$

<u>The President</u>: But you are a strong person with lots of courage. I want you to know that we are with you in your fight. Give my love to your son and your daughter. (U)

<u>President Duarte</u>: Thank you very much for all your kindnesses. (U)

The President: Are you in the hospital? (U)

<u>President Duarte</u>: No, I was supposed to go to the hospital at Walter Reed but I couldn't go because of my problem. (U)

<u>The President</u>: You need to overcome your problem. You have your wonderful family with its love. I want you to know that we care very much. When you do come to Walter Reed I hope to come out and visit with you again. (\mathbf{g})

President Duarte: Thank you very much. (U)

The President: We send our love to you and your family. God bless you. (U)
