## MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

SUBJECT: The President's Telephone Call to Prime Minister Xenofon Zolotas of Greece

The President initiated the call.

The President: Mr. Prime Minister?

Prime Minister Zolotas: Yes, I am the Prime Minister.

The President: I am pleased to say hello. I am calling about the upcoming meeting in Malta. I have been touching base with all of the countries in NATO, in a spirit of full consultation. I want to assure you there will not be some major arms control deal that does not have the full approval of NATO. I would welcome any thoughts you have.

Prime Minister Zolotas: I will be coming to the NATO meeting. If I have any thoughts I will send them.

The President: I look forward to seeing you December 4 in Brussels.

Prime Minister Zolotas: I fully understand your position. I am looking forward to the success of your deliberations with Mr. Gorbachev. Thank you for your call.
