DATE, TIME August 6, 1990, 10:07 - 10:10am EST
AND PLACE: The Oval Office

The President: I had a long shot of an idea. We're meeting this afternoon with Margaret Thatcher and Manfred Woerner. Perhaps you could come down and have supper with me, or have lunch tomorrow at the White House. You've been so helpful with Ozal and everything else, I thought it just might be worth doing. If not, we can do it another time this week. Or we can just keep in touch by phone. I just thought, you've been with us shoulder to shoulder. It's Canada's business, and you're just an hour away.

Prime Minister Mulroney: That sounds very helpful. Is Margaret coming in today? (U)

The President: She's coming through on her way to the funeral. There is no pressing agenda, but there is a lot to talk about. Her remarks yesterday were very good. Come on down and bring who you want. (U)

Prime Minister Mulroney: I'll call you back. We're talking about tonight? (U)

The President: Right. Supper at 7:00, and we might even give you a drink at 6:30. (U)

Prime Minister Mulroney: I'll be right back to you. (U)
