

## MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

Telephone Conversation with President Mubarak of Egypt (U)

The President President Mubarak of Egypt Notetaker: C. David Welch

DATE, TIME AND PLACE: August 30, 1990, 2:54 - 2:56 p.m. EST The Oval Office

The President: Hosni, how's my friend? (U)

President Mubarak: I'm doing well, George. (U)

<u>The President</u>: You don't sound as upbeat as usual, my friend. Anyways, I just wanted to tell you that I just announced a major proposal for international compensation for countries, like Egypt, that are most affected by Iraq's invasion and sanctions compliance. I would add the comment that Egypt is at the top of our list. We will encourage others and we will help also. ( $\mathcal{C}$ )

<u>President Mubarak</u>: I am relying on you mainly, George. ( $\mathscr{L}$ )

<u>The President</u>: We will be talking to you about the FMS problem in the next few days.  $(\mathscr{Q})$ 

<u>President Mubarak</u>: On this FMS debt, I just paid you \$90 million today.  $(\mathcal{G})$ 

<u>The President</u>: Your appeal is at the top of my list. I have to get it through Congress. But I thank you again for all you have done. (b) (1)
