AND PLACE: Camp David

The President initiated the call. (U)

President: Hosni, how are you? (U)

President Mubarak: Hello George, how are you. (U)

President Bush: Fine. (U)

President Mubarak: We were just sitting here thinking of you and

Barbara. (U)

President Bush: Great minds think alike. Barbara and I are at Camp David; it's very cold. I was just thinking of you, counting our blessings. (U)

President Mubarak: I want to wish you a happy new year. (U)

President Bush: Thank you, this will be an interesting time. I have not changed my mind about the importance of getting Iraq out of Kuwait without conditions. (2)

President Mubarak: In a speech tonight, I'm calling on him to be courageous and respond to peace. But he won't do anything. (2)

President Bush: I agree. We'll have to do something, and by something I mean to implement the UN resolutions. Don't be discouraged by the controversy here you've read about. It is just the Congress. (2)

President Mubarak: I understand. (2)

<u>President Bush</u>: The EC is talking about sending somebody to see Aziz. This is fine, but there can be no compromise. (\emptyset)

<u>President Mubarak</u>: There will be no result if there is a meeting with the EC. (\cancel{Q})

<u>President</u>: I don't know if I should say something about seeing Aziz. Nothing will come out of that. You know he's accusing me of drinking. He's crazy. (2)

<u>President Mubarak</u>: You know, I sent him a tough message. I was very frank. (\mathcal{L})

President: Have you received an answer? (U)

President Mubarak: Well he just received it last night. (U)

President: What did you say? (U)

<u>President Mubarak</u>: I told him to get out. That it was going to be a problem you don't want around you. (2)

<u>President</u>: It's important he gets a clear message. I'm tired of saying the same thing. He's so unreasonable. (\mathscr{C})

President Mubarak: Yes, he is a strange man. (2)

President: He is. Well, I didn't call to commiserate about him.
I called to wish you and Susie a happy new year. (U)

<u>President Mubarak:</u> Happy New Year to you and Barbara. Is Barbara there? (U)

President: Yes, she's here with me at Camp David. But she's
gone swimming. (U)

Mubarak: In the cold? (U)

President: Well, we have an indoor heated pool here. (U)

President Mubarak: Well we're shivering here. Anyway, all the best. (U)

President: All the best to you and Susie. Is Susie there, I
want to say Happy New Years to her. (U)

President Mubarak: Yes, she's here. She's on the line. (U)

President: How is the beautiful fiancee? (U)

Mrs. Mubarak: Oh she is doing fine. (U)

President: Give her a hug from me; we can't do it in front of
the cameras. (U)

Mrs. Mubarak: I will Mr. President. All the best to you and happy New Years. (U)

President: All the best. Good bye. (U)
