SUBJECT: Telephone Conversation with Prime Minister Brian Mulroney of Canada

PARTICIPANTS: The President
Prime Minister Brian Mulroney
Adrian Basora, NSC Staff (Notetaker)

DATE, TIME January 9, 1991, 3:02 p.m. - 3:06 p.m.

PLACE: Oval Office

The President: Hello, Brian. I am just calling to tell you about Jim Baker's meeting in Geneva today. They stonewalled and they refused to accept our letter, which was not conciliatory of them. There isn't anything secret going on. They repeated the same positions. (S)

Prime Minister Mulroney: I had him (Tariq Aziz) on CNN and I turned it off in disgust. I was extremely disappointed that he wouldn't accept the letter. (S)

The President: I just wanted you to know that what you see is what you got. (S)

Prime Minister Mulroney: We will need to talk further on a secure line at some time. (S)

The President: I will also be calling Mitterrand, Kohl and Hawke. So long. (S)

Prime Minister Mulroney: Goodbye. (U)
