President Lacalle of Uruguay called the President on January 16 at 7:30 in the evening to show his support for the President's actions in the Persian Gulf. (\emptyset)

There was no notetaker from the Latin American Directorate and no interpreter. Neil O'Leary, Director of the Situation Room, monitored the conversation, but did not take notes. He remembers the conversation as being very short and supportive, and told Mr. Pryce shortly after the call that it went something like this: (\emptyset)

President Lacalle: I want to know that we are with you in your actions in the Gulf. We are praying for you and your people. You have done the right thing. I hope that Barbara is okay. I wish you well. (2)

The President: Thank you very much for your support. It means a lot to me. Barbara is well. The accident was not serious. We wish the best to you and your family. (2)
