MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

Telcon with Brian Mulroney, Prime Minister of

Canada

(Early portion of call not monitored.)

The President: No one knows I am going back down to do this.

 (\mathcal{Z})

Prime Minister Mulroney: I won't say a word. (U)

<u>The President:</u> The Soviets have been very constructive, but Saddam is still setting new oil fires. He has brutalized the Kuwaitis. I wanted you to know that, in the spirit of consultation. (\mathcal{L})

<u>Prime Minister Mulroney</u>: Do you hold out any hope at all for reconciliation of your approaches on the final terms? (Z)

The President: No, but he asked me to stay in the UN for another 48 hours. However, we have a problem here because I spelled out the ultimatum for Saddam yesterday. He fires missiles, talks peace to the Soviets, but shows no signs of peace. I said I can't do this, I don't see any way unless he moves out of Kuwait.

Prime Minister Mulroney: Did he say he would get hold of Saddam?

The President: He didn't say that. (U)


<u>Prime Minister Mulroney</u>: Are there lines of communication open, just in case, with Gorbachev? (**Q**)

The President: I don't know. We don't have lines to Saddam, but maybe Gorbachev has lines to him. (\mathcal{L})

<u>Prime Minister Mulroney</u>: It has been a long, tough one. I don't agree with the New York Times very often, but I have to say,

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execution of the war so far has been unrivaled in terms of your accomplishments in rallying this coalition and holding it together. \mathscr{U}

The President: You're nice to say that. I hope now that it will be very, very fast. The casualties will be there and it worries all of us, but I think they will be less than some predictions say. I say that because a lot of destruction has gone on to his armor. The early probing actions are going very, very well. The coalition is predicting rapid surrender, etc. This may be some wishful thinking. But I hope it's not long. We'll move fast. There we are. (2)

<u>Prime Minister Mulroney</u>: I look forward to seeing you on the tube at 10 and give my best to Barbara. (\mathcal{L})

The President: I am instructing Cheney to move ahead. (₡)
