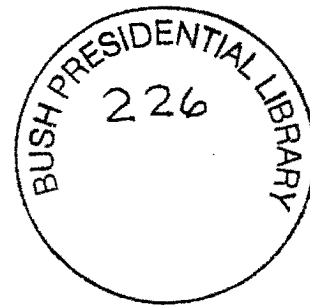

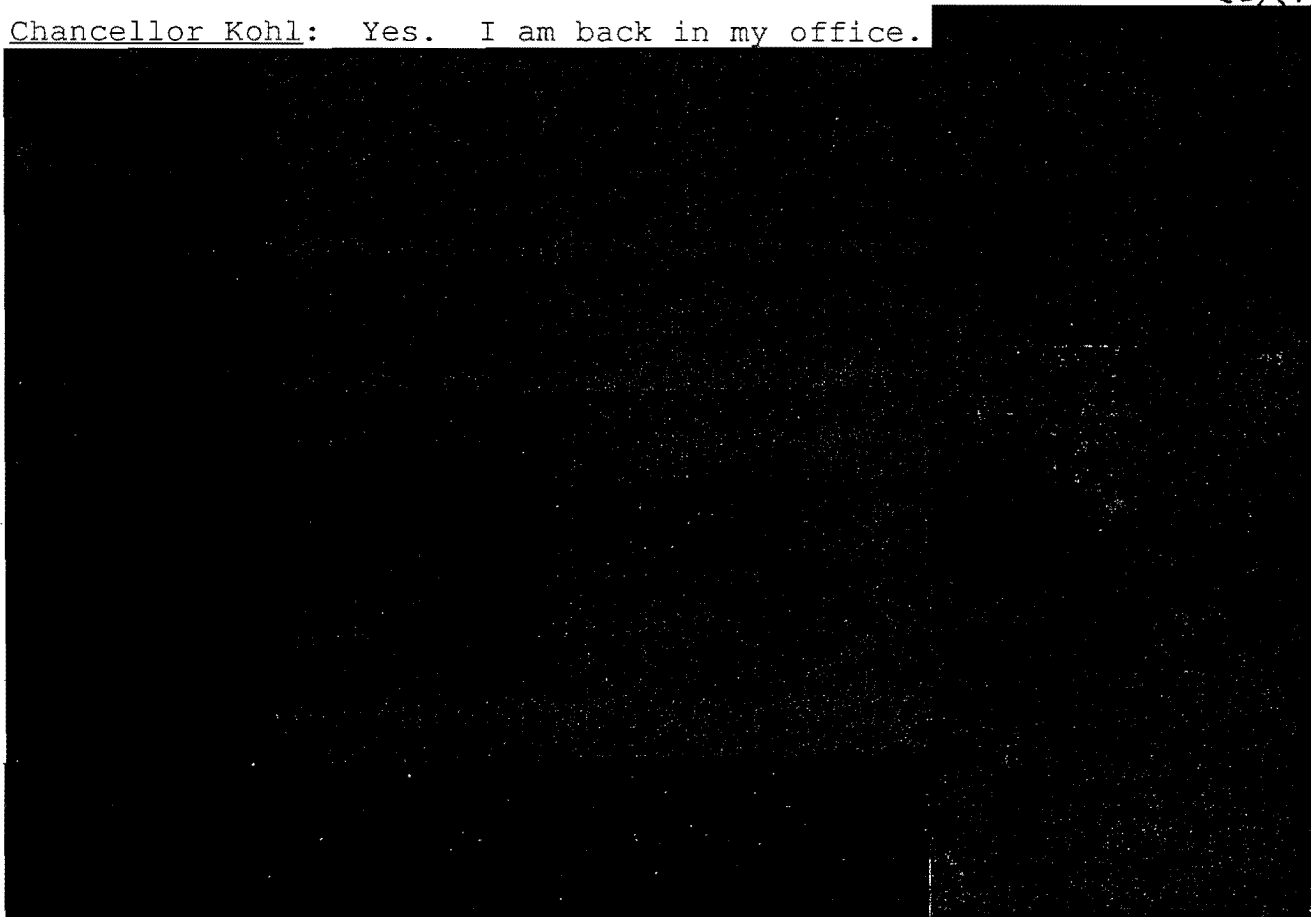
The President: Helmut? (U)

The President: Not bad. Not bad. Are you on vacation, Helmut? (U)

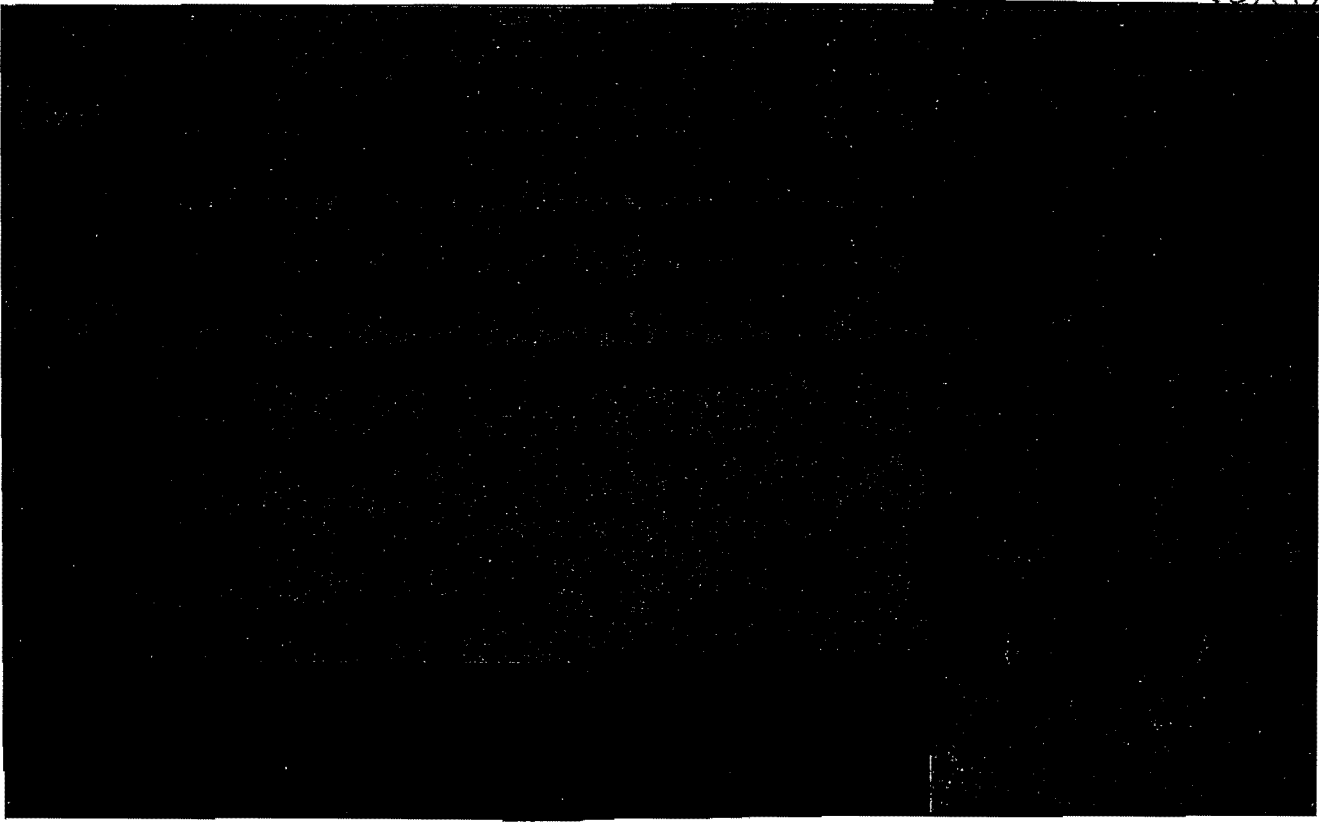

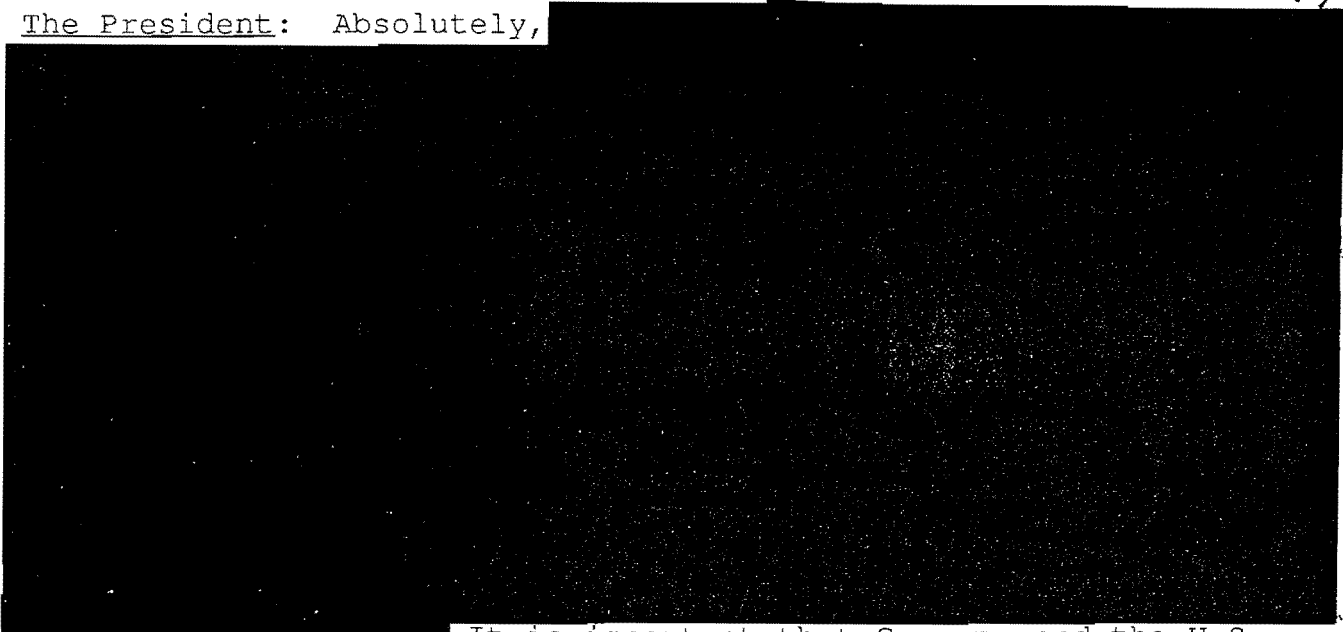
