The President: Hello, Boutros?

Dr. Ghali: Yes.

The President: How are you? Where are you?

<u>Dr. Ghali</u>: Waiting for a plane at Frankfurt for Caracas for the G-15 meeting. I will represent President Mubarak there.

The President: I wanted to congratulate you on your big, big victory in the UN Security Council (UNSC recommended Ghali as next UN Secretary General). There are going to be great challenges and I wish you well. I know things will go swimmingly in the General Assembly. We respect you very much. You will have the support of the US and my personal support.

<u>Dr. Ghali</u>: I will do whatever should be done for peace and security and reinforcing the UN with your collaboration and blessing.

The President: Brent Scowcroft also sends his best to you. Jim Baker is very pleased. He was here this morning when we met with Shamir. All the US people are just delighted. I hope you get off to a running start, and God bless.

Dr. Ghali: Thank you.
