MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

SUBJECT: Telcon with Kiichi Miyazawa, Prime Minister
of Japan on December 20, 1991

PARTICIPANTS: The President
Kiichi Miyazawa, Prime Minister
Notetaker: Torkel Patterson, NSC

DATE, TIME: December 20, 1991, 7:30 am EST
AND PLACE: The Oval Office

The President: Hello Kiichi. How are you?

PM Miyazawa: Yes Sir, Mr. President. How are you?

The President: Very glad to hear from you sir. I'm looking forward to my visit. I think it is an important time. I want to talk politician to politician if I may.

PM Miyazawa: Which we are.

The President: Yes, we are, aren't we? You know there's a bad economic mood here in this country with our economy struggling and its threatening my efforts to take a firm stand against protectionism here.

Perhaps Mike Armacost has told you, I'm sending a small team ahead with a message relative to the trade side.

PM Miyazawa: Oh, you are?

The President: Yes, I hope you'll be able to give them a little of your time. Its important. Baker's right hand man, Zoellick and others will be there so there can be no disconnect on the trip.

PM Miyazawa: Yes, I'll be happy to receive them.

The President: I know it's a bad time but we'll try to work it so it's most convenient for you.

PM Miyazawa: It's alright.

The President: Zoellick knows my heartbeat on this one. I hope you get some rest over the holiday season.

PM Miyazawa: I'm looking forward to seeing you.
