The President: Turgut? (U)

President Ozal: Yes, George, How are you? (U)

The President: I'm fine. I am just calling to check up on my friend. How are you feeling? (U)

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<u>President Ozal</u>: Good, George. My temperature is down, and I'm feeling much better. Everything went very well.

The President: What's next? Will you stay in the hospital for a while? (U)

<u>President Ozal</u>: I'll stay another week, then spend a week in the hotel and return to Turkey. (\mathscr{C})

The President: I just wanted you to know I'm thinking of you, and I wanted to check up on how you are doing. Let us know if there is anything we can do to make your stay more pleasant. (U)

President Ozal: Thank you. I am very sorry about the situation
in Los Angeles. (U)

The President: I'm out here in Los Angeles right now. It has been a heartache for everyone here, but it is going to get better. Our press has not been helpful. (♥)

<u>President Ozal</u>: Everything will go as you wish, George. Semra sends her best wishes. Best wishes from both of us to you and Barbara. (U)

The President: She is up in Maine now, fixing up our house. At least that's one problem I don't have to worry about. Take care, my friend, and give my best to Dr. DeBakey. (U)
