President Bush: Hello Your Majesty. (U)

The Amir: Good afternoon Mr. President. (U)

<u>President Bush</u>: I am just calling to see how you are doing, my friend. You've done a great job in Bahrain and you've always been a good friend.  $(\not z)$ 

The Amir: You've done a lot for us, President Bush. You have always been a friend of Bahrain and helped us. (U)

President Bush: Where are you now? At the hospital in Cleveland? (U)

The Amir: Yes, they told me today that everything is fine. I was sad to hear about the election. History will remember you, Mr. Bush, you accomplished great things. Especially in the Gulf. One day we want to see you in Bahrain. (U)

<u>President Bush</u>: I just wanted to wish you well. The Bush family sends you our best. Some day our paths will cross again, I'm sure. (U)

The Amir: Give my regards to Barbara. (U)

<u>President Bush</u>: I will. We're in Maine on the Atlantic coast. It is cold but clear today. I just wanted to extend my regards to my good friend and wish you well. (2)
