

JOINT RESOLUTION

Supporting the actions taken by the President with respect to Iraqi aggression against Kuwait.

Whereas the armed forces of Iraq have invaded and occupied the territory of Kuwait, have taken large numbers of innocent hostages, and have disregarded the rights of diplomats, all in clear violation of international law and norms of international conduct;

Whereas the United Nations Security Council has condemned these actions as blatantly unlawful, has imposed mandatory economic sanctions designed to compel Iraq to withdraw from Kuwait, and has called on states to take all appropriate measures to ensure that these sanctions are enforced;

Whereas the President, in response to requests from governments in the region, and in exercise of the inherent right of individual and collective self-defense, has deployed U.S. Armed Forces into the Persian Gulf area to deter further aggression, to protect American lives, to assist in enforcement of sanctions, and to defend friendly states in the region: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States in Congress assembled, That the Congress strongly supports the immediate goals and policies outlined by the President: (1) the immediate, complete, and unconditional withdrawal of all Iraqi forces from Kuwait as mandated in United Nations Security Council Resolution 660; (2) the restoration of Kuwait's legitimate government; (3) the protection of the lives of American citizens held hostage by Iraq, both in Iraq and in Kuwait; and (4) a commitment to the security and stability of the Persian Gulf.

SEC. 2. The Congress strongly supports the actions taken by the President in support of these goals and policies, including the involvement of the United Nations and of other friendly governments. The Congress urges continued use by the President of diplomacy and economic sanctions as the preferred means of dealing with Iraqi aggression, and of protecting American lives and vital interests in the region.
