RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the United States, along with the participation of 27 other nations, is engaged in the war with Iraq; and

WHEREAS, it is the hope and prayer of the Mayor and Council that the military conflict can be ended as quickly as possible; and

WHEREAS, it has been an existing policy of the United States that, after defeating an enemy in time of war, United States tax dollars are used to help rebuild war-torn nations; and

WHEREAS, the oil fields of Iraq, at the end of the conflict, will be available as a source of revenue to the 28 nations involved in this war effort; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the expenses of this war be extracted from the Nation of Iraq, which has, by its actions, caused this great conflict.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the City of Warner Robins urge President George Bush and the members of the United States Congress to appropriate from the oil fields of Iraq the oil necessary to allow the 28 nations to recoup the expenses of this conflict, said money to be used not as compensation for the injury to or death of members of the allied forces but as compensation for the out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the nations in their effort to liberate Kuwait and free its people.
