
Dear John:

Just a quick note of thanks for your thoughtful letter. Of course, I'm pleased that the ground war ended in 100 hours and that there were far fewer casualties than had been widely predicted. I'm also very proud of our troops, our coalition partners, and our whole team.

I appreciate your suggestion. However, as you know, the United Nations Security Council resolutions do not include provisions that allow the occupation of Iraqi territory. Nevertheless, we will continue working on reparations and other issues still to be resolved.

Dear Mr. President:

With regard to Iraqi reparations, and the certainty thereof, I suggest that the two oil fields in Southern Iraq be secured by the Alliance forces, placed under a United Nations mandate, and, assuming sufficient reserves, the off-take revenues be used as Iraqi reparations.

Concerning your performance, it has been truly magnificent. The ramifications of your achievements are yet to be fully appreciated. But I suggest that you have restored the presidency and the military to their pre-Korean War stature.

I submit, for example, that had this anti-Iraqi action preceded the Iranian hostage debacle, that affair would never have happened.

I should also commend in the highest possible terms, the executive team you created to help you -- Scowcroft, Cheney, Powell, and Baker. Having been a student of leadership since World War II, I consider that the team you have is second to none in the modern history of our Republic.
