Dear Mr. Plonski:

Thank you for your letter of May 13 to President Bush concerning the plight of Kurds in Northern Iraq.

We share your concern for the Kurds, and for many years, the U.S. government has pressed the Iraqi government to improve its abysmal human rights record. We have also encouraged the use of Iraq's rich oil resources to benefit all of the country's ethnic, religious and ideological groups. Although we are sensitive to the legitimate concerns of the Kurds and Iraq's other minorities, we do not envisage direct U.S. intervention to shape a successor regime. As President Bush has said, these matters are for the Iraqi people.

Nevertheless, the United States has a clear interest in the course of events in Iraq. We have maintained US and coalition forces (British, French and Turkish) in Turkey since April 1991 to protect civilians in northern Iraq. We continue to press Iraq to abide by UN Security Council Resolution 688 and to cease repression of its civilian population throughout the country. Saddam Hussein has a great deal to answer for, and President Bush has made it clear that the U.S. government will not resume normal relations with Iraq as long as Saddam Hussein remains in power.

Because we are sensitive to the Iraqi regime's threats against the Kurds and Iraq's other ethnic and religious groups, we strongly support international humanitarian relief efforts throughout Iraq. More broadly, U.S. policy will continue to advance our vision of a democratic, tolerant Iraq which respects the rights of all its citizens, including Kurds, and one that lives at peace with its neighbors.
