"I just got word from the Pentagon that two to four Warthogs from Grissom Air Force Base will fly over the parade at low level," Keesing said. "I have to go to Grissom next week to work out the final details. This is going to be great."

Tanks of World War II vintage will also be in the parade, according to Keesing. In addition, a memorial ceremony for all who have fallen in war will be conducted at the end of the parade route.

"This all started as a whim but it has gotten so big that now I'm getting a lot of help," Keesing said. "The people of Middletown are really pulling together and helping me with all of the work that has to be done."

Downtown businesses will decorate storefronts and yellow utility poles will be tied to every tree, utility pole and street sign along the parade route, according to Keesing.

Five weeks before the parade, more than 30 floats, color guard units, and businesses have signed up to participate. Two area high school bands will also march in the parade.

Yorktown and Madison Heights high school bands have already told me they will be in the parade," Keesing said. "Pendleton, New Castle and Shenandoah band officials said they would like to participate but haven't told me for sure."

The parade is not just a local activity. "We plan to have parade units from many east central Indiana communities," Keesing said. "We want to celebrate the homecoming of Desert Storm U.S. servicemen and women who have served in time of war."

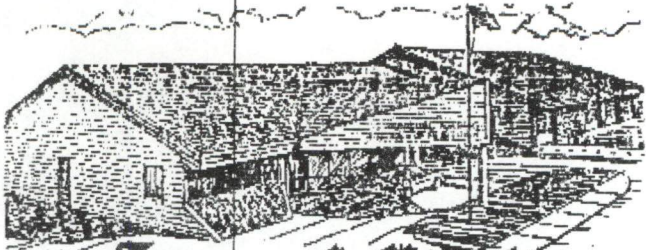

Plans for the "Red, White and Blue Welcome Home Parade" to honor the men and women who served in the Persian Gulf, as well as other war veterans, are getting bigger each day, according to parade organizer William Keesling.

"I have about 12 people helping me with parade plans," Keesling said. "We meet every Tuesday and this thing just gets bigger and bigger every time we meet. It's great."

Keesling said, and a letter from President George Bush is to be read at the event.

Keesling said he is very excited about the way the parade is shaping up and that he never dreamed it would turn out so well.

"This all started out as a whim but it has gotten so big that now I'm getting a lot of help from friends, neighbors and people who just want to help this parade become a big success," Keesling said.

Jennifer Decker, an eighth-grade student from New Castle who will sing the national anthem at the memorial services, typifies the spirit of the event, according to Keesling.

"She is a very patriotic little girl," Keesling said. "She wrote a letter to the editor to the New Castle paper sharing her patriotic feelings about our flag. She is a great singer. She has appeared in shows at Beef and Boards Dinner Theater in Indianapolis and starred as "Annie" in both Anderson and Richmond."

I am pleased to send greetings to everyone gathered for this special occasion dedicated to U.S. troops in the Persian Gulf region. This is a wonderful way to stand in solidarity with our brave service men and women who are now taking part in the liberation of Kuwait.
