SUMMARY: This memorandum forwards for your consideration a proposed Executive order prepared by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). This proposed order would permit VA to contract with private facilities to help provide health care services for veterans and Armed Forces personnel on active duty in Operation Desert Storm.

BACKGROUND: Section 5011A of title 38, United States Code, provides that the Department of Veterans Affairs may furnish hospital care and medical services to Armed Forces personnel on active duty during a national emergency declared by the President that involves the use of the Armed Forces in armed conflict. As part of that care, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs may, upon request by the Department of Defense, enter into contracts with private facilities to provide hospital care and medical services for veterans.

By contracting out with private facilities, VA could free bed space for treatment of Armed Forces personnel during and following Operation Desert Storm and continue treatment for other veterans.

The proposed Executive order would invoke the provisions of section 5011A, permitting VA to enter into contracts with private facilities for the provisions of hospital care and medical services for veterans, in the event the Department is requested to provide services for Desert Storm personnel.

None of the affected agencies objects to the proposed Executive order.

RECOMMENDATION: I recommend that you sign the proposed Executive order.

SUMMARY: This memorandum forwards for your consideration a proposed Executive order prepared by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). This proposed order would permit VA to contract with private facilities to help provide health care services for veterans and Armed Forces personnel on active duty in Operation Desert Storm.

BACKGROUND: Section 5011A of title 38, United States Code, provides that the Department of Veterans Affairs may furnish hospital care and medical services to Armed Forces personnel on active duty during a national emergency declared by the President that involves the use of the Armed Forces in armed conflict. As part of that care, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs may, upon request by the Department of Defense, enter into contracts with private facilities to provide hospital care and medical services for veterans.

By contracting out with private facilities, VA could free bed space for treatment of Armed Forces personnel during and following Operation Desert Storm and continue treatment for other veterans.

The proposed Executive order would invoke the provisions of section 5011A, permitting VA to enter into contracts with private facilities for the provisions of hospital care and medical services for veterans, in the event the Department is requested to provide services for Desert Storm personnel.

None of the affected agencies objects to the proposed Executive order.

RECOMMENDATION: I recommend that you sign the proposed Executive order.
