MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Army General Officer Nomination

I recommend you designate the position of Commanding General, Theater Army Area Command (Operation Desert Shield), as a position of importance and responsibility to carry the grade of lieutenant general under the provisions of title 10, United States Code, section 601. An officer assigned to this position is responsible for the coordination of host nation, maintenance, and logistical support to the Army in the theater of operation.

I also recommend the continued assignment of Major General William G. Pagonis in this position and his appointment to the grade of lieutenant general. General Pagonis is 49 years of age.

In order to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the proposed assignment, a general officer must have demonstrated highly effective performance in senior logistical positions. He must possess a thorough understanding of the requirements of the Middle East theater of operations including war plans and the political environment, and have the ability to work well with senior officials from other Services and other nations. General Pagonis meets these requirements.

The above action will not result in the Army exceeding the number of officers authorized to be serving in the grade of lieutenant general. As required by title 10, United States Code, section 601(d)(1), I have attached an evaluation of General Pagonis' performance in a joint assignment from the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff.



General John Michael "Mike" Loh is vice chief of staff, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. General Loh was born March 14, 1938, in Washington, D.C., where he was raised, graduating from Gonzaga High School in 1956. He was a distinguished graduate of the United States Air Force Academy in 1960, majoring in engineering science, and earned a master of science degree in aeronautical engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1973.

General Loh completed the Air Force Fighter Weapons School in 1966, Air Force Test Pilot School in 1968 and Air War College in 1978.

After graduating from the Air Force Academy, General Loh completed pilot training at Craig Air Force Base, Ala., in October 1961. He then served as a fighter pilot flying F-102 fighters in Massachusetts and Japan from July 1962 to September 1965.

Upon returning to the United States, General Loh flew F-4C and F-4D fighters with the Tactical Air Command's 33rd Tactical Fighter Wing, Eglin Air Force Base, Fla. In October 1968 he was assigned to the 366th Tactical Fighter Wing, Da Nang Air Base, Republic of Vietnam, where he flew 204 combat missions in F-4C, F-4D and F-4E aircraft over North and South Vietnam.


After his combat tour of duty in Vietnam, General Loh served in the Pentagon on the Air Staff in the Fighter Requirements Division, Directorate of Operational Requirements, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Research and Development, from November 1969 to May 1972.

General Loh was awarded the Daedalian Fellowship for graduate study and applied it to earn his master's degree at MIT in July 1973. He then served as project manager for the YF-16 and YF-17 prototype development program and as projects director of the F-16 System Program Office at Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, until June 1977.

After completing Air War College in June 1978, General Loh returned to Tactical Air Command as deputy commander for operations, and vice commander of the 23rd Tactical Fighter Wing, England Air Force Base, La., flying the A-7D from June 1978 to April 1981.

From April 1981 to July 1985 General Loh served on the senior staff at Headquarters Tactical Air Command, Langley Air Force Base, Va., as assistant deputy chief of staff for operations and requirements, and as deputy chief of staff for requirements. He then returned to the Pentagon, where he served as director of operational requirements, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Research, Development and Acquisition, from August 1985 to July 1987.

General Loh returned to Aeronautical Systems Division as vice commander in July 1987, and became commander in August 1988. He assumed his present position in June 1990.

I recommend you designate the position of Commanding General, Theater Army Area Command (Operation Desert Shield), as a position of importance and responsibility to carry the grade of lieutenant general under the provisions of title 10, United States Code, section 601. An officer assigned to this position is responsible for the coordination of host nation, maintenance, and logistical support to the Army in the theater of operation.

I also recommend the continued assignment of Major General William G. Pagonis in this position and his appointment to the grade of lieutenant general. General Pagonis is 49 years of age.



GENERAL JOHN MICHAEL LOH

General John Michael "Mike" Loh is vice chief of staff, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. General Loh was born March 14, 1938, in Washington, D.C., where he was raised, graduating from Gonzaga High School in 1956. He was a distinguished graduate of the United States Air Force Academy in 1960, majoring in engineering science, and earned a master of science degree in aeronautical engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1973.

General Loh completed the Air Force Fighter Weapons School in 1966, Air Force Test Pilot School in 1968 and Air War College in 1978.

After graduating from the Air Force Academy, General Loh completed pilot training at Craig Air Force Base, Ala., in October 1961. He then served as a fighter pilot flying F-102 fighters in Massachusetts and Japan from July 1962 to September 1965.

Upon returning to the United States, General Loh flew F-4C and F-4D fighters with the Tactical Air Command's 33rd Tactical Fighter Wing, Eglin Air Force Base, Fla. In October 1968 he was assigned to the 366th Tactical Fighter Wing, Da Nang Air Base, Republic of Vietnam, where he flew 204 combat missions in F-4C, F-4D and F-4E aircraft over North and South Vietnam.


After his combat tour of duty in Vietnam, General Loh served in the Pentagon on the Air Staff in the Fighter Requirements Division, Directorate of Operational Requirements, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Research and Development, from November 1969 to May 1972.

General Loh was awarded the Daedalian Fellowship for graduate study and applied it to earn his master's degree at MIT in July 1973. He then served as project manager for the YF-16 and YF-17 prototype development program and as projects director of the F-16 System Program Office at Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, until June 1977.

After completing Air War College in June 1978, General Loh returned to Tactical Air Command as deputy commander for operations, and vice commander of the 23rd Tactical Fighter Wing, England Air Force Base, La., flying the A-7D from June 1978 to April 1981.

From April 1981 to July 1985 General Loh served on the senior staff at Headquarters Tactical Air Command, Langley Air Force Base, Va., as assistant deputy chief of staff for operations and requirements, and as deputy chief of staff for requirements. He then returned to the Pentagon, where he served as director of operational requirements, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Research, Development and Acquisition, from August 1985 to July 1987.

General Loh returned to Aeronautical Systems Division as vice commander in July 1987, and became commander in August 1988. He assumed his present position in June 1990.
