Scope and Content

The materials in FA005 (Public Health) are a systematically processed body of documents from the White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject File. This secondary subject category contains materials relating to the federal government furnishing aid in such interrelated medical fields as research, facilities, and personnel. Subjects covered here include opposition to the use of federal funds for abortion, the need for more money to be utilized in Lyme Disease research and bone marrow testing, concern over the funding provisions of the Catastrophic Health Program, and the Breast and Cervical Cancer Mortality Prevention Act of 1990. The topic of one accordion file folder, the issue of abortion and federal aid receives a considerable amount of attention. Specifically, all of the letter writers want the

Bush Administration to remain steadfast in its ban on the usage of Title X funding for abortion counseling at taxpayer-subsidized clinics.
