Scope and Content

The materials in FE001 (Ceremonials - Protocol) are a systematically processed body of documents from the White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject File. This secondary subject category contains materials relating to signing ceremonies for bills and acts and the rules of etiquette in the cases of flying the flag at half-mast and how the President and Vice President should greet the leaders of foreign countries, especially those the U.S. does not view as friends or allies. Constituents write in suggesting certain pieces of legislation be commemorated as special occasions, and Bush and his advisors exchange memos in which they decide who will be invited to the signing of the Clean Air Act, for instance. In addition, there are letters from congressmen and Senators urging Bush to order flags to be

flown at half-mast on the 50th anniversary of the bombing of Pearl Harbor to honor the servicemen who died during this battle.

System of Arrangement

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in Bush Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files.

The WHORM Subject File compiled by the White House Office of Records Management is comprised of a series of documents assigned a letter/number combination and filed in a subject category.
