Provenance

Official records of George Bush's presidency are housed at the George Bush Presidential Library and administered by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) under the provisions of the Presidential Records Act (PRA).

Scope and Content

The materials in FE002 (Declaration of Independence – Constitution) are a systematically processed body of documents from the White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject File. This secondary subject category contains materials relating to the Constitution in some fashion. There did not appear to be any records concerning the Declaration of Independence. Letter writers addressed such topics as the constitutionality of the Boland Amendment, the need for an amendment banning the burning of the American flag, and the inaction of Congress with respect to the passage of a balanced budget amendment. This subject code has more than enough documentation to show clearly that the Bush Administration expended a great deal of effort in providing support to state and local officials

regarding their attempts to restore meaning to the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution. Warren Burger, Chairman of the Commission on the Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution, presented Bush with annual reports and plans were made in conjunction with the National Archives for a Bicentennial of the Bill of Rights Tour.

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in Bush Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files.

The WHORM Subject File compiled by the White House Office of Records Management is comprised of a series of documents assigned a letter/number combination and filed in a subject category.
