Official records of George Bush's presidency are housed at the George Bush Presidential Library and administered by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) under the provisions of the Presidential Records Act (PRA).

#### Scope and Content

The materials in HE001 (Diseases - Disabilities) are a systematically processed body of documents from the White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject File. This secondary subject category contains information about programs, diseases, and disabilities such as: Americans with Disabilities Act of 1989; United Nation Decade of Disabled Persons; Alzheimer's Disease; Chronic Fatigue and Immune Dysfunction Syndrome; accessible public transportation for people with disabilities; Anorexia Bulimia Care, Inc.; eating disorders; National Commission on Orphan Diseases; Act for Better Child Care; bus access to handicapped individuals; American Council of the Blind Federal Employees; Medicaid Home & Community Quality Services Act of 1989; Cystic Fibrosis Foundation; Hope Rehabilitation & Research

Institute for Brain Damaged & Comatose Patients; World Federation of Hemophilia; multiple sclerosis, thyroid disease; brain tumor research; Understanding and Living with Glaucoma; Retina Tissue Transplant Research Program; Tuberculosis Prevention Amendments; Down Syndrome; Donor Transplant Program; lead poisoning; Helen Keller National Center for the Deaf-Blind Youth & Adults; Autism Society of America; Lyme Disease Association of New York; biomedical research; Muscular Dystrophy Association, and Sickle Cell Center in Ohio.
