Provenance

Official records of George Bush's presidency are housed at the George Bush Presidential Library and administered by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) under the provisions of the Presidential Records Act (PRA).

Scope and Content

The materials in WE001 (Children (Welfare Services - Adoption - Abuse)) are a systematically processed body of documents from the White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject File. This secondary subject category contains correspondence, fact sheets, proposed testimony, speech drafts, enrolled bills, reports, and memoranda primarily concerning the ABC Bill (Act for Better Child Care), the improvement of day care, the Child Care Development and Improvement Act, the U.N. Convention on the Rights of the Child, and Family Tax Credits. This category contains a lesser amount of information on

infant mortality, child custody, catastrophic health care, missing children, children with disabilities, adoption, infant nutrition, international adoption, children and television, child support, youth employment, and Head Start. Of special note is correspondence between the White House and the Family Research Council, Heritage Foundation, and Eagle Forum concerning President Bush's agenda for children.

System of Arrangement

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in Bush Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files.

The WHORM Subject File compiled by the White House Office of Records Management is comprised of a series of documents assigned a letter/number combination and filed in a subject category.
